Keynote Speech: Building a sustainable future: Making higher education attractive and internationally competitive

The following areas may be explored

- *How can national policies and regulatory frameworks create an environment conducive to international collaboration and engagement in higher education*
- *Brand awareness of the country*
- *To develop a strategic approach to internationalization*
- *Shifting mobility patterns and international recruitment initiatives*

- *To prepare students to be active and engaged in an interconnected world*

Session I: Accelerating education innovation: Integrating technology in higher education

The following areas may be explored

- *Technology allows institutions to experiment with new models of outreach and how institutions can leverage technology to accelerate internationalization*
- *The emerging approaches, opportunities and challenges for faculty and administrators*
- *How to use information and communication technology (ICT) in education and activities of university?*

- *The continuing debate about the influence of rankings and the impact that rankings have played on policy, practice, and academic*
- *How higher education scholars and administrators tackle rankings in their own institutional contexts?*

- *What role can institutional research (IR) play at your university? Does it really enhance the current and future organizational effectiveness and the quality of decision-making?*

The questions which Moderator will put to stimulate the discussion and dialogue are:

- *How do we best understand the changing student expectation in the digital age? What services do they need and want?*
- *How does your university support transition into living and learning at University for students and promote integration and participation?*
- *How does your campus prepare staff to work with students?*
- *Could you please share insight from your work on some of the particular challenges facing students? What can be done to better support them?*
- *What are the key factors for student satisfaction at your university? Could you please share with us actions taken to enhance positive learning experiences?*
- *What are the specific support that can be given to students for their future career?*
- *What are the future challenges for delivering an excellent student experience?*

一、搭乘大眾運輸工具

■ 捷運

1. 文湖線：大直站 1 號出口右轉大直街步行約 5 分鐘。
2. 淡水線：圓山站 1 號出口至「捷運圓山站」公車站轉乘 21、208、247、287、紅 2 往大直內湖方向路線公車至北安路「捷運大直站」。
3. 板南線：忠孝復興站轉乘捷運文湖線（往南港展覽館）至大直站 1 號出口。

■ 公車

1. 至北安路「捷運大直站」公車路線：21、28、33、42、72、208、222、247、256、267、286(副)、287、646、902、紅 2、紅 3、棕 13、棕 16。
2. 至明水路「大直加油站」公車路線：33、42、645、紅 3、藍 12。

二、自行車

■ 臺北地區

1. 行經建國高架道路（北上方向）→往基隆方向中山高速公路匝道→濱江街交流道→大直橋→下橋直行崇實路→右轉大直街 62 巷本校正門口。
2. 行經新生高架道路（北上方向）→圓山匝道靠右往大直方向→北安路→左轉崇實路→右轉大直街 62 巷本校正門口。

■ 外縣市地區

1. 北上方向：中山高速公路→濱江街交流道→大直橋→下橋直行北安路 501 巷→右轉大直街 62 巷本校正門口。
2. 南下方向：中山高速公路→堤頂交流道（往大直內湖方向）→堤頂大道→內湖路一段→北安路→右轉大直街→右轉大直街 62 巷本校正門口。
