PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This summer school program aims to cultivate participants' aesthetic taste and knowledge of classical Chinese art, develop their multi-cultural perspective, and inspire their creativity and ego through an initiative project. The project-oriented courses are a mixture of **theoretical classes**, **hands-on workshops**, **on-site visits**, and are run by professors and experts from universities and the cultural and creative industry.

The program is designed to introduce participants to the best Chinese cultural practices by providing a precious opportunity for participants to perform Chinese creative drama, and to develop network of cultural and creative industry contacts in China.

Develop the new perspectives on values, life, and the world offered by several courses on progressive Chinese culture.

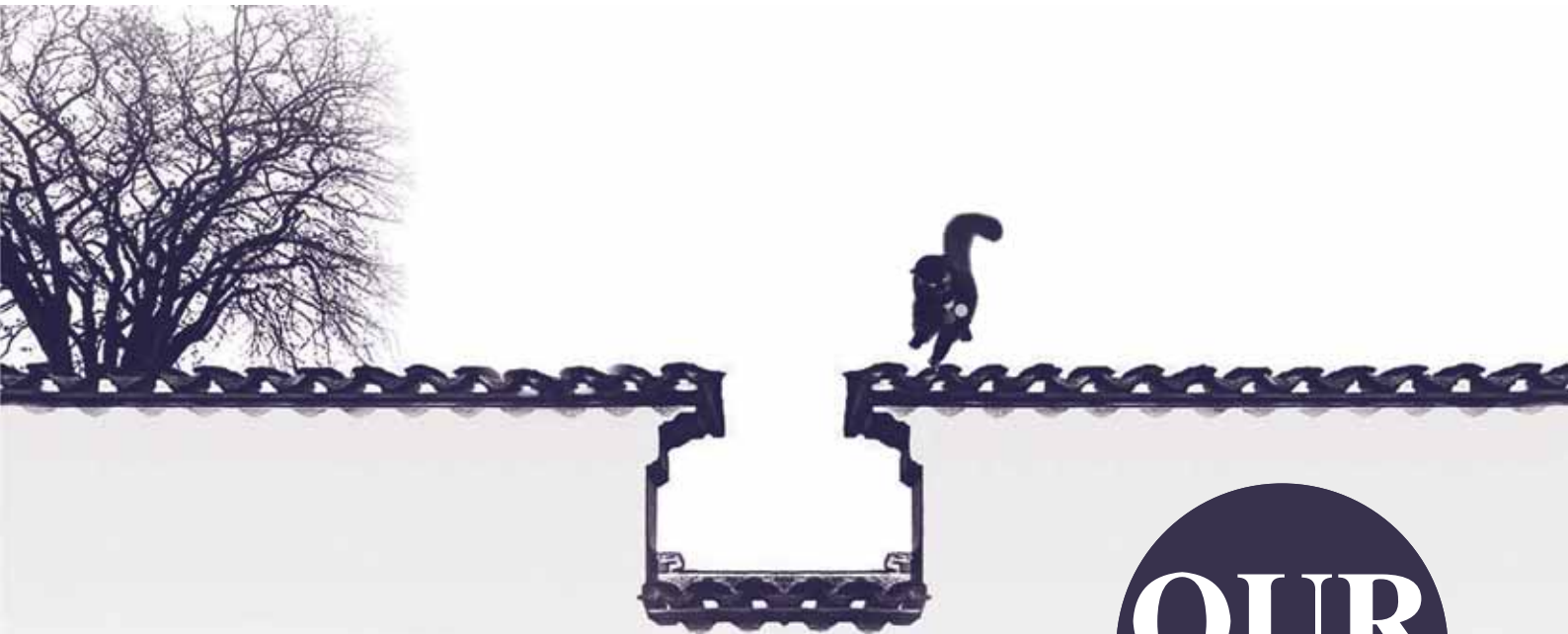

Professor ZHOU Bin

(Academic Director)

He is currently professor and doctoral advisor of USC-SJTU Institute of Cultural and Creative Industry, and director at the Institute of International Communication of Chinese Calligraphy Culture.

Since 1993, Professor Zhou has received many awards including the Outstanding Contribution Award for International Communication of Chinese Language and Culture as well as the Calligraphy Art Award. His thesis on calligraphy have won awards in the Global Calligraphy Forum. Professor Zhou is chief editor of the Dictionary of Contemporary and Modern Calligraphers and Calligraphy Evaluation & Appreciation. He is also a co-author of "Calligraphy – A Self-taught Course", "College Calligraphy Course Book and A Brief History of Calligraphy."

As a renowned professor and artist, Professor Zhou Bin is dedicated to international exchange of calligraphy culture and cross-cultural communication, with a mission to break down cultural and language barriers and connect people from different backgrounds around the world through calligraphy, one of the world's long and great artistic traditions. He initiated a calligraphy class in the United Nations Headquarters and was praised by the former UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon as a "Master of Calligraphy" and an "Ambassador for Calligraphy".



As an important envoy in international calligraphy education and cross-cultural communication, Professor Zhou has created a great impact with his academic activities to build a bridge of mutual understanding and mutual appreciation.

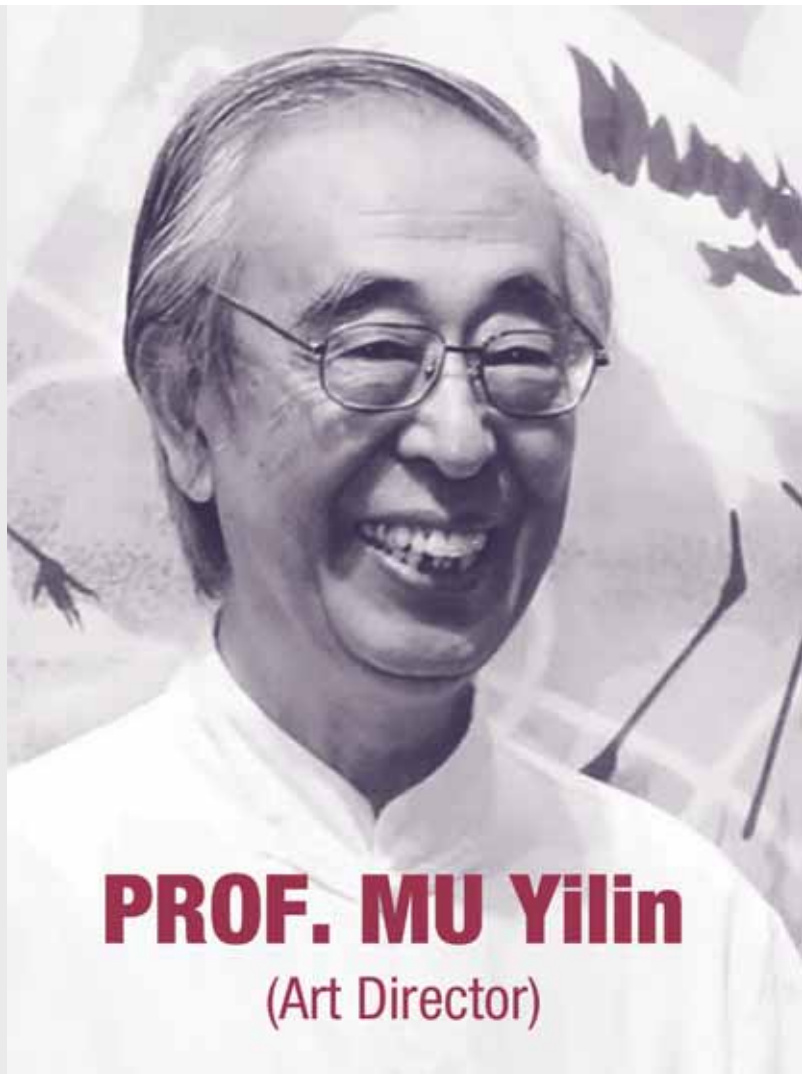
She has long-term focused on the field of theater management, art festival management, the project management of live performances (musical, symphony, opera, dance, drama, concerts, etc.).

GODWIN Kwame Tamakloe

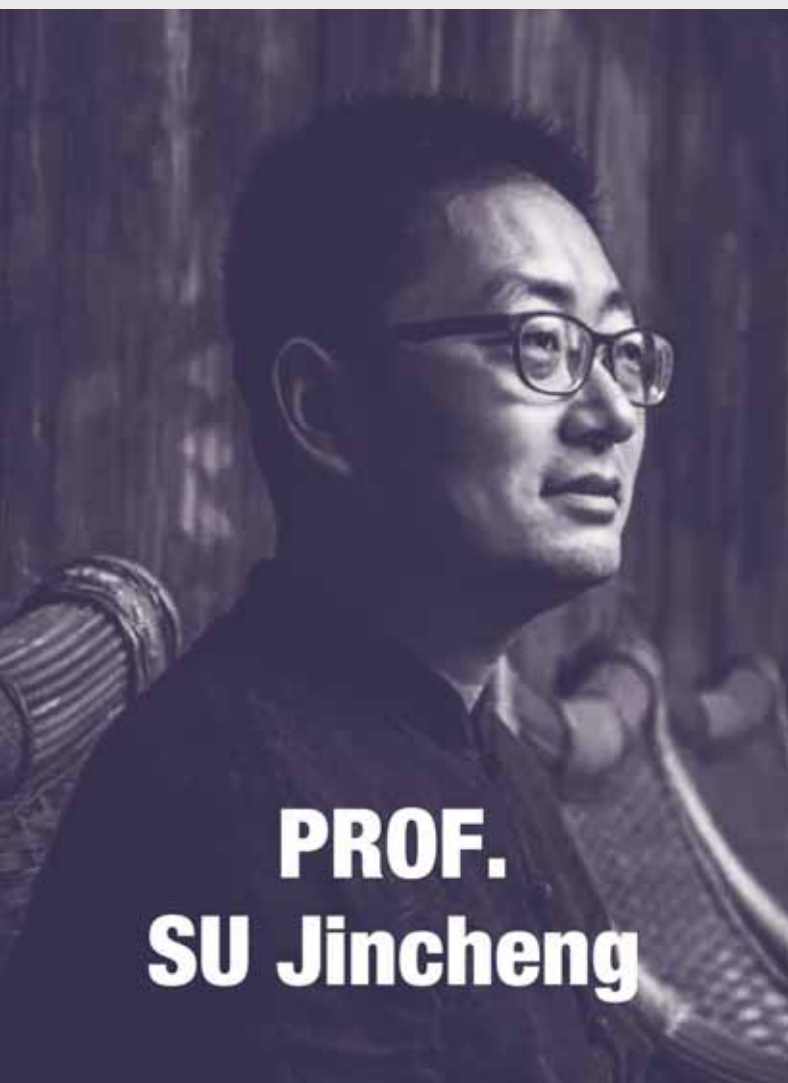
Godwin Kwame Tamakloe has his bachelor's degree in the School of Performing Arts, University of Ghana, Legon and master's degree in the Directing Department, the Central Academy of Drama. He is currently a full-time drama teacher at Beijing New Talent Academy, free-lance theater and film director and a part-time actor for steps drama. He is also Youth Ambassador for ACTIONAID GHANA. In September 2014, he was a performer and also a facilitator for the Morgan Stanley Workshop, responsible for facilitating the workshop.



Prof. MU Yilin (born 1944 in Shanghai), a member of the Chinese Art Association, is the representative inheritor of intangible Cultural heritage like traditional Chinese painting (Bo Painting) , as well as the executive director of the Shanghai Intangible Cultural Heritage Protection Association. His inheritance and research, since 1983, into ancient Chinese Bo Painting created a unique modern Bo Painting art and has made a significant contribution to the renaissance of Chinese painting in the world. His artworks are collected by world-famous dignitaries. Professor Mu also won the first prize of the International Chinese Exhibition held by the Chinese Ministry of Culture, the first prize of the Shanghai Art Exhibition and more.

Prof. SU is a member of the China National Academy of Sculpture, China Literature and Art Critics Association and the Shanghai Artist Association. He is a master of traditional Chinese painting and calligraphy, as well as a postgraduate supervisor at the College of Fine Arts at the Shanghai University. His art works are exhibited and collected by foreign dignitaries and institutions from China, Japan, Italy and so on. Prof. Su is the dean of Shanghai Huixin Mercy Painting and Calligraphy College. For many years he engaged in public welfare undertakings, and was awarded a placement amongst the 'Shanghai Top 10 volunteers' and a nomination for 'The 100 most beautiful volunteers of China'.



ASSOCIATE PROF. LI Yan

Prof. LI is a national second grade actress. She is also an opera figure teacher (opera figure is a fundamental course containing over 300 different types of traditional Chinese opera. It optimizes an actor's coordination and beauty with the rhythm.) for the Shanghai Theater Academy's Traditional (Chinese) Opera School. Ms. LI is the leader of the opera figure subject, and she has won the National Art Awards several times. She is also the opera figure lecturer at the Chinese University of Hong Kong and many European and American training programs.

Dr. AMARANTIDOU Dimitra

Dr. Amarantidou is a young Confucian scholar. She has a Ph.D in Chinese philosophy from the East China Normal University. She was invited to attend the "Gasification • feel through time: Zhuangzi and Confucianism - ancient and modern change forum second workshop", the first International Youth Confucian Forum and other meetings. Her translation work includes "Chinese philosophy twenty stresses", "contemporary Chinese philosophy research: 1949-2009" etc.



CURRICULUM

CHINESE CULTURE

The culture class takes the classroom teaching and the practice as the main form, supplemented by the art lecture. This module enables students to have a glimpse of the Chinese culture.

CREATIVE DRAMA

Creative drama is an improvisational, non-optional, process-oriented form of drama. Participants develop their skills and knowledge from classic Chinese stories, poems, biographies, legends and world theatre with the coach of supervisors.

EXPECTED ACHIEVEMENTS

1. Graduation Exhibition. Each student will finish at least one Chinese calligraphies, one Chinese ink painting.
2. Creative drama performance. All the students will work together to complete a creative drama performance featured with Chinese cultural elements. We will invite representatives from the industry to watch and comment.
